

Synergy Group - a dynamic provider of integrated ship management services to the international shipping industry began its two-day annual seafarer seminar on September 3 at the Radisson Blu Resort in the historic town of Mahabalipuram, which is an ancient historic seaport. Themed "Surabhi" after a Sanskrit word that means excellent, the well-attended meet emphasized, throughout, Synergy's core values, its persistence, and pride in its ethical behaviour and adaptability.

This shared ethos was quite apparent when Capt Rajesh Unni, Founder and Visionary of the Group, spoke, "Let's focus on our values, and then nothing can stop us', he said, highlighting, with examples from various sports, the value of teamwork and of celebrating each other's successes. He spoke about the 1990 World Cup football match between Argentina and Cameroon which even after a guarter of a century stands apart... how the mighty Argentinian team led by the great Diego Maradona was

vanquished by an unheralded team - in a spate of 90 minutes the once derided African team became credible. He also spoke about the 'David mind-set



Keeping the focus on the customer as top priority, he pointed out, giving extreme examples of personnel from the Tai Mahal hotel who had risked, and even lost, their lives, protecting guests during the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks. On the opposite side of the spectrum were examples of the Sewol and Costa Concordia incidents, where trained seafarers could have done better in terms of customer focus.

The conference was replete with an eclectic mix of topics, with experts addressing issues faced during shipboard operations today, Brijesh Bassi, Synergy Group, spoke on 'Inspections and vessel screening'. The presentation by John Martin of GARD on personal injuries and crew claims was followed by the examination of environmental issuesnew regulations on ballast water treatment (by Bill Yoon of Techcross) and emission control areas (by Deepak Kamran). In addition, 'Harry Potter and shipping' was a very















interesting presentation by Arthur Kozyra & S. Mishra.

The evening of 3rd Sept had a treat in store for the delegates, with Chennaibased actress and VI, Paloma Rao compering the Seafarer Awards ceremony. The rock band 'Indian Ocean' followed soon thereafter, and, later came a DI, an open bar, and an elaborate dinner.





The second day of the seminar saw the seafarer delegates temporarily split for simultaneous sessions. While Sanieev and Babu from Alfa Laval addressed the engineers on main and auxiliary engine failures, Capt Anoj Sarma and Capt PH Shivaram spoke to the navigating officers about accidents and groundings. Later, owners' presentations and Justin Murphy's 'Synergy seafarers-delivering first class customer service' were two sessions that were widely appreciated. John Martin returned with 'Operational Risk- Nine stories'; he was followed, towards the end, by Dr Vis of the Viswa Group, who spoke on bunker analysis.

A closing ceremony and a vote of thanks by Synergy's Capt Rohit Banta brought down the curtains on a well planned and executed event, where Maritime Matrix Today and The Marex Bulletin were the premier media partners.

A day prior to the conference, Synergy

had organised, as part of its CSR activities, a visit to an orphanage and old age home that it supports on the outskirts of Chennai. Gifts were distributed to the residents. 


The effortlessness at Synergy is amazing; communication is easy and the office staff is helpful and approachable. I feel as if I am working for an ownership company and not a management company.
